Luther Court Society, in partnership with BC Housing and the Government of B.C., is excited to announce that construction has started on a new 95-unit intergenerational affordable housing development in Saanich.

Located at 3781 Cedar Hill Cross Rd. in the heart of the Shelbourne-Cedar Hill corridor, residents will live close to amenities like grocery stores, coffee shops, financial institutions and community-focused organizations. Designed to be much more than an apartment building, the property will feature more than 3,000 square feet of indoor and outdoor programming spaces where people of all ages can come together and connect in community.

Luther Court's Intergenerational Affordable Housing development is made possible thanks to a \$15.6-million investment from the Province, through BC Housing's Community Housing Fund.

These affordable homes will accommodate people across all ages with low to moderate incomes and offer a mix of subsidized and market rental rates, with 15 studios, 75 one-bedrooms, and five two-bedroom suites that will be available. The new building will connect to the existing Luther Court facility through a walkway. It is expected to be completed in Summer 2027.

This new rental housing will help address the evolving needs of younger and older adults – many of whom are looking for a safe place to not only live, but to thrive.

For 45 years, Luther Court Society has united community and transformed lives for older adults through its innovative campus of care. The local non-profit has become a hub for intergenerational wellness that inspires connection across all ages. Thanks to its growing network of supporters and partners, Luther Court enhances the quality of life for even more people in Greater Victoria.

The majority of residents at Luther Court are in their 80s or older. A year and a half ago, we welcomed a new resident: 26-year-old Isabel. An avid reader, Isabel had reviewed countless articles on intergenerational living. Reflecting on her experience at Luther Court she shares, "it is wild to be in this intentional community and experience it all first-hand." For Isabel, connecting across generations is as simple as finding an empty chair in a common area and sitting there until someone comes along - and someone always does. She is proud that she has formed strong friendships with two of her neighbours – one of whom is 100 years young. They dine together most evenings at the garden café on site.
